Copyright law vis-à-vis Freedom of Speech and Expression in Relation to Technological Protection Measures Under Copyright Act, 1957: A Critical Study of the Interface

1. Introduction

The modern history of human civilization shows us that we have always treasured the freedom of speech. The Universal Declaration of Human Rights marks the freedom of speech and expression as a right that is integral to the enjoyment of all other rights. The right of an author to benefit from the protection of the moral and material interests resulting from his or her scientific, literary or artistic productions is enshrined in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, 1948 and International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights, 1966. Copyright is a form of property, the right to protection of which is guaranteed by various human rights instruments and/or national constitutions. It is argued that constitutional or human rights protection for copyright may flow from its ability to promote the same interests that are safeguarded by freedom of expression. Constitution of India, 1950, by virtue of Art. 19(1) (a) guarantees fundamental right to freedom of speech and expression. Copyright furthers democratic discourse by providing rights that enable independent writers and artists to make a living from their expression.¹

Copyright law seeks to achieve balance with respect to creativity by providing two-fold protection. It protects the interests of the creators of content for a limited period of time, allowing them to monopolize their creation. At the same time, it protects the interests of the society at large by giving access to such content. Copyright and freedom of expression have been viewed as harmonious and complementary concepts. In *Harper and Row Publishers Inc. v. Nation Enterprises*,² the Court

Ensuring Dignity to Manual Scavengers – Legal Mechanism and Social Reality

Abstract :

In 21st century the practice of manual scavenging exists in India and it is the ground reality of our social set up. It is very sad to see that such inhuman practice still exist in India after 72 years of independence. The practice of manual scavenging is derogatory to the dignity of any human being which results into the violation of human rights. The advancement of technology, science and even an artificial intelligence does not help to eradicate such inhuman practice from the society. It means, despite the introduction of several mechanized systems of sewage cleaning, human intervention in the process still continues. The people of backward class and lower income group who don't have any alternative involved into such practice. Though our country is a developing country and progressing in every field but failed to eradicate such inhuman and degrading practice of untouchability. In this article researcher tries to discuss the social set up and various factors responsible for manual scavenging and its effect. The researcher also analyses the legislative mechanism and judicial decisions with an intention to find out the major lacunas in the existing legislative framework. mechanism^s

Key Words: Manual Scavenging, Human Rights, Untouchability, Caste, Varna System etc.

Introduction :

Manual scavenging practice exists in India from the Vedic period which violates the fundamental rights of sanitation workers and government failed to protect their fundamental rights which are guaranteed under Part III of Indian Constitution. Constitution of India strictly prohibits any types of untouchability¹ but when we talk about manual scavenging we observed that it is a caste based occupation. It means particular community compelled to do this inhuman work which includes to clean septic tanks or sewer tanks with bare hands and if they failed to do such work they faced to violence, discrimination, starvation and social boycott. So for their daily rozi roti they have to work such inhuman practice. They denied employment in other fields because of their caste stigma. It passes on from generation to generation. Culture of acceptance prevailing among them is also depriving them of their basic rights.

Meaning of Manual Scavenging :

The General meaning of manual scavenging is to clean human excreta and other waste products manually with their bare hands from insanitary latrines, open pits, sewer tanks,

section of the society. Indian judiciary is the custodian of rights of common man including the deprived class of the society. Through liberal interpretation, the judiciary always tried to achieve the concept of social welfare. The liberal interpretation of Art. 21 opens the Pandora box of various rights and that is the reason Art. 21 is termed as colourless article or residuary article. With regard to judicial response towards the manual scavenging recently courts have adopted strict attitude towards the manual scavenging and pulled up the State authorities for failing to eliminate such heinous practice from the society.

In landmark case *Safai Karmachari Andolan v. Union of India*¹³, the Apex Court acknowledges the menace of manual scavenging in India as an inhuman, degrading and undignified profession. The Apex Court observed that PEMSAR Act, 2013 and EMSCDL Act, 1993 neither dilutes constitutional mandate of Art. 17 nor it does condone inaction on the part of Union and State Government under EMSCDL Act, 1993. The Apex Court held that the PEMSAR Act, 2013 expressly acknowledges Art. 17 and 21 of the Constitution as the rights of person engaged in sewage cleans and cleaning septic tanks as well person cleaning human excreta on railway tracks.

The Supreme Court finally stressed on the rehabilitation of manual scavenging in accordance with Part IV of PEMSAR Act, 2013. The Supreme Court directed the State Government and Union Territories to fully implement various provisions of PEMSAR Act 2013 and take appropriate action for non-implementation as well as violation of provisions contained in PEMSAR Act, 2013.

Conclusion

From above discussion we can say that the State and local bodies are found to be guilty for not establishing, maintaining sewage system, septic tank and failed in ensuring protection and security of manual scavengers. India is developing country and specially in a modern age, practice of manual scavenging is very shameful for our country. We all as a society should raise voice against such inhuman practice which is making some person among us to clean septic tank or human excreta manually without any regards to their safety and letting them to die. On the other hand we turn out our faces to avoid such disgusting sights without even realizing that some people are cleaning tank for us to keep us healthy. This is the violation of human rights and it's time to take cognizance of such inhuman practice to lead them dignified life.
